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Hello Peel Region! - can you help us support grieving kids?

Under expert guidance by bereavement professionals, they will strengthen family bonds, develop skills and reduce mental illness in a safe, fun-filled space.

Toby Young and Gena Dyer are among the many who have completed the New Families Camp. Following the death of their baby son Eithan, during the final trimester of pregnancy, the couple found themselves not only juggling their own personal grief, but that of their older children Cloey and Deegan as well.

"It's given us a really good toolset for dealing with the different things the kids have gone through. They experience grief in a different way to mum and dad. Quite often mum and dad don't have all the answers or the ability to deal with it all. So being able to have that toolset to navigate some of those challenges...has really helped us be there for them," Toby Young said.

"The people involved – they are angels, carers we can't live without. They've given us a fun and supportive way of life," Gena Dyer added.
